I've seen a \$52,000.00 invoice floor me and then see almost \$30,000.00 deducted in a few days time. I've seen a \$10,000.00 potential shortage staring me in the face and the next morning receive text announcing a \$10,000.00 donation erase the potential deficit. We've scratched our heads as to how is such and such expense going to be met back in The Yukon and then open an email announcing \$750.00 deposited into our Canadian accounts in the Yukon.

Yet I still, even in moments of solid faith, have a nagging propensity to fear. I'm the "ye" of "oh ye of little faith."

Why would God use a guy like me?

"For ye see your calling, brethren, how that not many wise men after the flesh, not many mighty, not many noble, are called: But God hath chosen the foolish things of the world to confound the wise; and God hath chosen the weak things of the world to confound the things which are mighty; And base things of the world, and things which are despised, hath God chosen, yea, and things which are not, to bring to nought things that are: That no flesh should glory in his presence." (1Co 1:26-29)

Every success we see has nothing to do with us, it is all God. Praise the Lord, as of right now, financially we stand at \$0 outstanding balance after the right hip replacement surgery.

On August 30th some 10 weeks post op, the left hip replacement surgery commenced and at the time of this writing we are 5 days into her recovery. And it's going like most major surgery recoveries go. Good days, setbacks, leaps forward and plateaus. Time is our friend and needless to say, Lois is an excellent patient. We are not sure when she will be released to travel, but as soon as that happens we will return to The Yukon and continue serving the Lord there.

Through this ordeal I have leaned heavily upon my pastor. His support and encouragement has been priceless to Lois and I.
